

# 5 common ways to sequence a blueprint

## *World-Related*

Sequenced according to how world is organized (time, space, etc.). **Example:** Teaching music history by era.

## *Inquiry-Related*

Teaches ideas together because they represent similar phases of inquiry. **Example:** Research class follows steps of research process.

## *Utilization-Related*

Teach most commonly used concepts first. **Example:** QI measurement would teach run charts first, then control charts.

## *Concept-Related*

Organize content by the structure of the discipline. **Example:** General science would start with matter, then atoms.

## *Learning-Related*

Build on knowledge and go from familiar to unfamiliar. **Example:** Geography might start with city, then province, then country.
